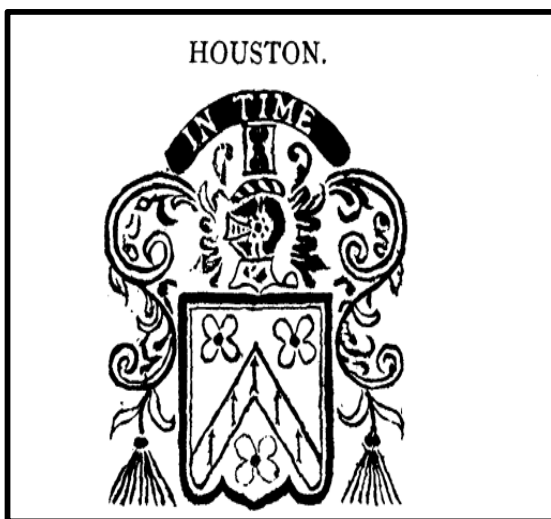
Page 1 - BURNS
